

International Educators Workshop (IEW) FAQs

Do you have 6 months validity remaining on your passport?

Many countries, including Sweden and Denmark, require that your U.S. passport has 6 months validity remaining for entry (in other words, your passport should not expire for at least 6 months after your planned travel dates for IEW). If your passport does not have the required validity, renew it as soon as possible to ensure you have a valid passport in plenty of time prior to your departure date.

When and where should I arrive and depart?

Participants should plan to arrive in Stockholm by Sunday, October 22 and depart Copenhagen on Saturday, October 28. DIS will facilitate the transfer between Stockholm and Copenhagen in the late afternoon/evening of Wednesday, October 25.

Homestay in Stockholm: DIS may be able to accommodate early arrivals to homestays on Saturday, October 21, for participants wishing to spend more time with their hosts. If you're interested in arriving on Saturday and taking part in your hosts' weekend plans, please email iew@dis.dk. While DIS cannot guarantee homestay accommodations on Saturday, October 21, we are happy to facilitate if possible.

I signed up for a Homestay in Stockholm - when will I have more information?

DIS makes Homestay arrangements in Stockholm for all participants who signed up for this option before the deadline. Participants will be connected to their Homestays approximately 1-2 weeks before the start of the workshop.

Most of our hosts, as in U.S. cities, live in the suburbs and not in the city center. Homestay participants will travel daily on Stockholm's public transit system, up to 60 minutes each way, using a transportation pass provided by DIS. Participants will typically be picked up by their hosts at the Stockholm airport.

Gifts for your Homestay - A small gift is a nice gesture, but by no means obligatory. Some suggestions include a token from your state (e.g. food, chocolates, book, college hat or t-shirt, bottle of liquor or wine from your home region). It is also a good idea to show some photographs of your family – your host will be curious.

How do I get between Stockholm city center and the airport?

<u>Train</u>

The Arlanda Express runs between all terminals at the airport and Stockholm Central Station. You can purchase tickets at the airport's information desks or at self-service machines. The train ride to Stockholm Central Station takes about 18 minutes. The ticket costs 320 SEK (approx. \$30). You can also buy a ticket via the Arlanda Express website using a credit card.

<u>Taxi</u>

Taxis are found outside Terminal 2 and 5. It takes approximately 40 minutes to get to the city center from the airport. The cost of the taxi will be approximately 850 SEK (approx. \$75-85) and they accept major credit cards for payment.

How do I get to Copenhagen from Stockholm?

DIS will arrange group transportation for all IEW participants from Stockholm to Copenhagen on Wednesday, October 25. We will be taking the <u>SJ High-Speed Train.</u>

How do I get to my hotel once in Copenhagen?

Upon arrival to Copenhagen Central Station (Hovedbanegård), participants will be responsible for getting to their accommodations. DIS staff will be available to help direct participants; most <u>recommended</u> hotels are a short metro ride and/or walk from Copenhagen Central Station, but there are also taxi stands located at the station. For information about ground transportation in Copenhagen, please consult Copenhagen's Local Transportation website here.

What should I wear during the Workshop?

Stockholm has a much milder climate than most other regions of the world that lie as far north and Copenhagen has a moderate maritime climate similar to that of Seattle, Vancouver, and London. The average temperature in October is 40-45°F. It is a good idea to pack layers and bring a raincoat for the wind and rain.

Be sure to bring along a pair of comfortable shoes as Stockholm and Copenhagen are great cities to explore on foot, and many of the streets are paved with cobblestone. Elevators are not common in Copenhagen, and you will need to use the stairs frequently, including in the DIS buildings. "Smart" casual is recommended for meetings, visits, and social events during the Workshop.

How much money should I bring?

For Stockholm: Swedish currency is the krona (SEK). As of May 2023, 1 USD = 10.21 SEK and 1 SEK = 0.098 USD

For Copenhagen: Danish currency is the kroner (DKK). As of May 2023, 1 USD = 6.79 DKK and 1 DKK = 0.15 USD

Sweden and Denmark are virtually <u>cashless societies</u>. Please note that all cash machines require a PIN code to withdraw money.

Where can I find the Workshop schedule and how can I sign up for sessions?

Session registration will open in online registration approximately 1 week before the start of the workshop.

When can I meet with my students?

DIS will arrange a DIS student panel in both Stockholm and Copenhagen during the workshop with students from various institutions so that participants may learn about their experiences studying with DIS.

If you are interested in specifically meeting students from your home institution in Stockholm and/or Copenhagen, we ask you to arrange directly with your students.
