Clinic for Sexually Transmitted Infections

Who can attend the clinic?

Everyone can attend the clinic without referral. You can not make an appointment beforehand. Examination, tests and treatment in the clinic are free.

Examination and treatment in the clinic will be conducted by either a doctor or a nurse.

Is it possible to be anonymous?

You can get tested without giving details of your personal data. All collected information will be kept confidential to other hospitals and persons of authorities. Information given to others will only be permitted with a written acceptance from you.

You can not get treatment anonymous.

Which kind of test?

At the clinic it is possible to be tested for sexually transmitted infections (STI) e.g. Condylomas (genital warts), Chlamydia, Gonorrhoea, Genital herpes, HIV, Hepatitis B og C, Trichomoniasis and Syphilis.

The incubation period for STIs

There is a period from the time you had unprotected sex until the infection can be detected through tests. The period varies depending on the infection:

- Chlamydia approximately 3 weeks
- Gonorrhoea 1 week
- HIV 1 month
- Syphilis 3 months

When and how do you get the testresult?

Usually all testresults will be available after 5 working days. This includes HIV-test.

You have to come back to the clinic to get your testresults and treatment unless other is arranged.

If you have no symptoms of sexual transmitted infections, and only get a test for chlamydia and gonorrhoea, our secretaries can provide you the answers by telephone.

This requires that you have a personal code, which you will receive at your first visit in the clinic. If the test shows that you have chlamydia or gonorrhoea, you will be asked to come to back to the clinic for treatment and counseling.

Waiting time in the clinic

The clinic serves as an emergency room, this may involve some waitingtime. You can not expect to be seen in the order you have arrived, because different problems are managed in different rooms and by different staffmembers.
